

The framework used here is quite flexible, and can be adapted and used with older kids, teens, (and even adults). It allows students to use some of the language they already know about a given topic and helps them to add new words to that knowledge. Chloe is a CELTA, CAM, and IHYLCT qualified teacher who has been teaching for three years. Pronunciation is an inseparable part of any language and it should thus be a regular part of English lessons too. This workshop will explore various types of activities that can help foster your pupils' / students' pronunciation at all levels and make pronunciation something that everyone will look forward to.



Irena Hůlková is an assistant professor in the Department of English Language and Literature at the Faculty of Education at Masaryk University in Brno. She has a Master's Degree in English and German as a foreign language and holds a Ph.D. in English Philology. In the past she taught English grammar and syntax at undergraduate level and at present she specializes in phonetics and phonology. In 2021 Irena received the MU Rector's Award in Teaching Excellence in the category of the humanities.

When Irena started running courses of phonetics/phonology at the Faculty of Education in 2015, she fell in love with this discipline immediately and her passion for teaching pronunciation drove her to establish her own YouTube channel entitled "Anglická výslovnost s Irenou" in 2019 with the aim of introducing this expertise to common users of English. In 2020 she founded an Instagram account named "Anglická výslovnost s Irenou", where she regularly presents short Reels dealing with commonly mispronounced English words.

The talk is focused on the concept of "reálie" and is therefore aimed mainly at secondary school teachers. It seeks to explore the relationship between "reálie", intercultural competence, the maturita exam and the relevant curricular documents, as well as to offer a platform for discussion of the participants' current practice and the underlying beliefs. If you want to discuss the usefulness and relevance of cultural information in Czech ELT and get some tips on the way, this is the session for you.



Tom has been teaching since 2014. He is CELTA and Delta (M1 ; M2) qualified and holds an MA in teaching English and German from Masaryk University. In addition to working as an examiner for Cambridge, teaching at both a secondary school and a university, he keeps himself busy by struggling with a PhD in corpus linguistics at Charles University. His research interests revolve around corpora, learner language and teaching methodology.
