





Feedback isn't just about providing the right answer; it's part of the language acquisition process. When and how should feedback be given and does it have to involve the teacher? This session explores ways for students to evaluate their own work and that of their peers.



Charles spent the earlier part of his career in business in the UK. For much of this he was involved in Management training for a multinational retail company. Since 2005, after completing the CELTA course in Prague, he has been teaching English in Brno, Czech Republic. He currently teaches at Gymnázium Slovanské náměstí and for ILC International House, where he is involved in teacher mentoring and training. He also has wide experience teaching for businesses, specialising in legal and financial English.

Grammar is Fun!

Teaching grammar can be challenging because most students consider it boring or difficult. This workshop aims at showing that a grammar lesson can be interesting and engaging. Some practical ideas and games will be shared about different content (e.g. passive voice, irregular verbs, etc).

Top-down listening activities, such as relying on context or world knowledge before listening to a recording, have traditionally dominated in our classrooms. But does relying on top-down skills make our students better listeners? In this session we will explore the often-overlooked role of bottom-up listening skills (recognising sounds, syllables, structures etc.). So, lend me your ears and let's run through some activities developing bottom-up skills that make our learners better at listening tasks.



Ani is a CELTA, IH CYLT and DELTA (Module 1 and 2) qualified English teacher and the DoS at ILC IH Brno. She has been teaching a variety of age groups and levels for many years now. She originally comes from Armenia but her ELT travel map has included Beirut, China, Armenia and Czechia. She has also been working as an ELT mentor and teacher trainer with the British Council Armenia. Exam preparation classes regularly make use of sample exam questions, but teachers often see such materials as simply forms of practice rather than a potentially rich source of language and activities in their own right. This session will provide teachers with some practical hints and tips for getting more out of exam practice materials in a manner which has a positive impact on learner outcomes and motivation.



Ben has been a teacher for over 12 years and has worked in the Czech Republic, Jordan, Libya, Turkey, and Saudi Arabia. He has experience teaching nearly all age groups and abilities, including work in elementary schools around Prague. He also has an interest in web development, and indeed, has even coded apps with his students in mind.
